A message from the Chair

As I take the reins as Shaw and Partners Foundation Chair in 2021 from Cameron Duncan and pen my first newsletter message, I would firstly like to take the opportunity to thank Cam for his leadership over the last five years. Cam has overseen a period of immense growth in the charitable giving with over \$6 million raised and distributed to over 170 worthy charities since 2015.

In what was another year dominated by Covid-19, the Shaw and Partners Foundation continued its core approach of empowering our advisers and staff to fundraise for charity, albeit somewhat curtailed by Covid-induced lockdowns across the country.

Notwithstanding all the disruption, your Shaw and Partners Foundation managed to donate over \$1 million to charities around Australia in 2021, a huge effort by the team. That brings the total of giving since inception to over \$6 million!

The Shaw and Partners Foundation corpus continued its growth in 2021 and by the end of the year stood at \$1.3 million which puts us in a great position to continue our giving efforts in 2022.

As you will see in the coming pages each Shaw and Partners office around the country supported some amazing charities throughout the year. At a corporate level our support for Gus Worland's Gotcha4Life charity continued with a significant donation of \$100,000 and we also were proud to donate \$162,000 to Save a Child's Heart Australia: \$75,000 to Feel the Magic after sponsored teams from Erebus Motorsport made the Top Ten Shootout and a podium at the Bathurst 1000; and \$100,000 to JDRF (Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation), underwriting their annual gift matching day.

We supported a number of significant fundraising events in 2021 including International Women's Day with donations to Dress for Success and Lou's Place: Australia's Biggest Morning Tea for the Cancer Council; the Ready, Set, Tokyo Virtual Seat campaign for Paralympics Australia; and Vinnies CEO Sleepout in Canberra for homelessness.

During the pandemic in 2021 it became increasingly apparent that some of the country's key front-line support and mental health agencies were struggling to cope with the overwhelming demand for their services. In usual Shaw and Partners style, we stepped up with some amazing donations at a state and national level coinciding with RU OK? Day on the 9th of September donating \$300,000 to mental health charities across Australia.

These included donations to: Kids Helpline (\$120K); Lifeline (\$20K); RU OK? Day Foundation (\$20K); Gotcha4Life (\$20K); The Carers Foundation (\$10K); Outback Futures (\$10K); Raise (\$10K); Streetwork (\$10K); Soldier On (\$10K); Black Dog (\$10K); The Male Hug (\$10K); Roses in the Ocean (\$10K); Operation Flinders Foundation SA (\$10K); Breakthrough Mental Health Research Foundation (\$10K); Zero2Hero (\$10K); and Beyond Blue (\$10K).

Despite being one of the world's most locked down cities, our Melbourne office managed to hold their big fundraiser of the year again in 2021 for the Robert Connor Dawes Foundation – a virtual Connor's Run this year Your-Way-Any-Day! A huge effort from all involved as they raised over \$100K which will go towards battling paediatric brain tumours and supporting brain matters in the areas of research, care and development. Your foundation helped the fundraising effort with a \$25K donation to kick things off.

In Brisbane, the team again got behind Multiple Sclerosis for the MS Brissie to the Bay Ride where they raised over \$125K - a huge effort from the whole Brisbane office.

In Adelaide, our connection with the Mito Foundation continued again this year which saw our Team Dot go on the 35km Bloody Long Walk raising over \$38K with your Foundation dropping in \$8,300 to help the cause. We also donated another \$2,000 to Operation Flinders matching personal donations from SA State Manager, Fraser MacLeod and Investment Adviser, David Dall who joined the trek with disadvantaged youths.

Our Canberra office got behind 10 x 10 Philanthropy (\$5K) and the Ricky Stuart Foundation (\$16.5K) and in Perth they raised over \$13K for FightMND as Wayne Allard took part in the Rottnest Run Fun Half Marathon.

The major single fundraising event of the year again was our Institutional Trading Day which this year raised \$400,000 with funds donated to The Fund Manager's Foundation; The Australian Stockbroker's Foundation; Mirabel Foundation and National Aboriginal Sporting Chance Academy (NASCA).

Our last supported fundraising event for 2021 was getting behind the Shaw and Partners Atlantic Crew. You will read more about these four mates later who decided to row across the Atlantic from La Gomera in the Canary Islands to Antigua and Barbuda in the Caribbean in December along the way raising funds for Gotcha4Life. We supported the team with an initial donation of \$10K and National Head of Financial Planning, Charles Stewart, raised another \$9K for them at a fundraiser at North Bondi Surf Club.

As you will read in the coming pages it has been another HUGE year of giving again this year. I would personally like to thank all of the previous Foundation committee members including Harold Milner, Craig Sidney, Marcus Droga, David Erskine, Nicole Callan and Shayne Gilbert and the current committee Louise Rottier, Earl Evans, Cam Duncan, Amanda Graham, Fraser MacLeod and Andrew Hines.

Gotcha4Life was established in 2017 to reverse the tide of declining mental health and to reduce suicide throughout Australia. Gotcha4Life champions the idea of mental fitness, building the social and emotional muscle and the resilience required to deal better with the challenges that life throws at us.

Last year, Gotcha4Life funding allowed 37,854 individuals to participate in over 850 workshops or training dedicated to building the mental fitness of the nation.

Shaw and Partners donates \$162,000 to Save a Child's Heart Australia

Wednesday 12th of May 2021 was a special day at Shaw and Partners HQ in Sydney as Doron Lazarus, National CEO of Save a Child's Heart Australia, visited advisers and staff to talk about the unbelievable work they are doing to help underprivileged children receive life-saving cardiac surgery.

Shaw and Partners was proud to donate \$162,000 to Save a Child's Heart (SACH) Australia to help fit-out the new paediatric intensive care ward and pay for surgeries for a number of kids who ordinarily would not be able to access care in their own country.

SAVE A CHILD'S HEART

Save a Child's Heart (SACH) in Israel is a story of humanity above all else. Save a Child's Heart provides life-saving heart surgery at no cost, for sick children from countries, with little or no access to critical cardiac care. On average, a child receives life-saving treatment every 24 hours at SACH.

To date over 6,000 children have received life saving treatment from over 63 countries.

Save a Child's Heart also provides training scholarships for medical personnel from these same regions, providing the necessary specialist skills, so children can return home and be treated in their local communities. To date Save a Child's Heart has trained over 135 medical professionals.

As part of the commitment to addressing global health inequality, Save a Child's Heart has undertaken over 100 international medical missions, to conduct screenings and provide treatment around the world.

As a not-for-profit, these vital services would not be possible without companies like Shaw and Partners, whose support has ensured that many lives have already been saved and thousands more will be saved in the years to come.

LIFE SAVING SURGERIES

Over the past year, in addition to other vital projects, Shaw and Partners has provided funding for the life saving surgeries of three children.

Aklesiya Bereket Mehari is a two year old from Hawasa, Ethiopia. When she was almost two, her mother noticed her heart beating abnormally fast. Doctors referred Aklesiya to the cardiac center in Addis Ababa, where she was diagnosed with a serious heart defect.

In November 2021, Save a Child's Heart brought Aklesiya and her mother to Israel where she underwent two open heart surgeries.

Upon returning to Ethiopia her mother said, "We were so excited and happy to be home, because they saved my child."

Kidus Yared Sisay is an eight year old boy from Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. When Kidus was five years old, he had episodes of weakness and fainting and loss of appetite. His family took him to the hospital in Addis Ababa where he was diagnosed with Tetralogy of Fallot. In November 2021 Kidus left his family and bravely joined a group of other children, mothers to travel to Israel for his life saving heart surgery.

Benitha Ineza is an eight year old from Rwamagana, Rwanda; she loves math and when she grows up, she wants to be a pilot.

When Benitha was seven years old, she was diagnosed with a heart defect, weakening the heart muscle and if untreated may cause total heart failure.

At the Children's Home in Israel, Benitha was all smiles and loved to help take care of the younger kids. In December 2021 Benitha underwent surgery for a hole in her heart. She is heading home to Rwanda and an amazing life of energy and opportunity awaits her.



ISRAEL NEW CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL

Save a Child's Heart is excited to be in the final stages of completing their new USD\$65 million state-of-the-art International Paediatric Cardiac Center & Children's Hospital in Tel Aviv, Israel.

Over seven floors, it will be the largest of its kind in the Middle East, allowing them to double capacity to almost 1,000 children surgeries per annum. This will ensure even more children from around the world and Israel, will have access to the critical cardiac care they need.

A special thanks to Earl Evans, Allan Zion and the Shaw and Partners Foundation, who provided the funding for a new Paediatric Intensive Care room, used for the most critical cases.

With just a sleeping bag and three pieces of cardboard, Stephen braved one of the coldest and longest nights in Canberra to help raise awareness of people experiencing homelessness.

"The reality is that every night thousands of Australians experience homelessness. The reality check for me last night was hearing the stories from front line volunteers and case workers sharing their stories of the people who are affected. With the support of personal donors and the Shaw and Partners Foundation, I was able to raise \$20,800. To everyone who donated, thank you for your contribution, it is greatly appreciated." said Stephen Johnston.

The event nationwide raised close to \$8.4 million, with the ACT raising over \$960,000. Money raised will go to services who provide rough sleepers with emergency accommodation, clothes, blankets, food and water.

MS BRISSIE TO THE BAY



MEET NICOLE AND VANESSA

Two Brisbane companies were battling it out to be named top fundraisers at MS Brissie to the Bay bike ride on Sunday 13th of June. Finance corporations Shaw and Partners and Morgans Financial Limited were both cycling to support colleagues within their organisation living with Multiple Sclerosis (MS), a neurological condition that affects almost 4000 Queenslanders.

MS Brissie to the Bay is MS Queensland's premiere event that sees over 7,500 riders cycle in a range of courses from Southbank, Brisbane. The event raises essential funds for MS Queensland.

Our own Nicole Zell, a Dealers Assistant from the Brisbane office, has been living with MS for 10 years. "In 2010, the whole right side of my body went numb. I was admitted into the Mater hospital where assigned neurologists arranged MRI scans of my spine, however, they unfortunately didn't order scans of my brain. The following year when the symptoms and numbness returned, the doctors ordered scans of my brain which confirmed the devastating news that I had MS," said Nicole.

Despite working for competing companies, these women formed a great connection and friendship due to their shared experiences. "We met through the event and MS Queensland and now we often meet up for coffee and discuss our treatments and journey. It's great to have someone else to chat to who's thriving in their finance role while living well with MS," said Vanessa.

The Shaw and Partners Foundation donates \$8,250 to Paralympics Australia



About Liz

A savvy businesswoman and passionate about helping her community, Liz Dawes founded the Robert Connor Dawes foundation after her son passed away from brain cancer in 2013. Nine years on, she has grown the charity to be the biggest paediatric brain cancer foundation in Australia.

As CEO and Chairwoman of the board, Liz also manages Connor's Run, the country's largest paediatric brain cancer event with over 5000 participants, and has been crucial in lobbying the Federal Government to secure funding for a disease which kills more young people than any other cancer.

Liz has also participated in round tables with the top minds in paediatric brain cancer globally and was behind the AIM Brain Project (co-funded by the Federal Government), which ensures every child diagnosed in Australia and New Zealand has access to world-class genomics testing technology.

The Story

From a small town in Wisconsin USA, Liz Dawes has gone on to travel the world, lead multi-million dollar sales and marketing accounts and even start her own business. But in October 2011 Liz's world was turned upside down with the brain cancer diagnosis of her eldest son, Connor.

What followed was the complete unknown for Liz and her family, but now, nine years on, Liz has created the biggest paediatric brain cancer charity in Australia to ensure one day, no family has to go through what hers did.

Growing up in small town America, Liz majored in finance and marketing at the University of Wisconsin. She then went on to hold a number of high profile roles in sales and marketing across the United States before eventually moving across the world. After settling in Melbourne in 1999, Liz was not only raising three kids and running her own business, she also managed fundraising initiatives for the American Women's Auxiliary – raising significant funds for the Royal Children's Hospital. These were skills crucial to the founding and success of her own charity, the Robert Connor Dawes Foundation.


